SOLOIST HELENA COLINDRES, SOPRANO

Helena Colindres (they/them) is a nonbinary versatile vocalist, educator, and activist of Nawataketza ancestry. As a rising opera vocalist, they have performed roles such as the Governess in Britten's *Turn of the Screw*, Despina in Poulenc's *Les Mamelles di Tiresias*, and recently made their professional debut as Winnie in Beecher's *Sky on Swings* with Opera Saratoga. They have also had the pleasure of winning various voice competitions such as the Camille Coloratura Awards and the Sylvia Green Voice Competition.

Helena graduated from the Peabody Conservatory with their MM in Voice and Pedagogy in May 2022. They also have a BM in Voice and a BA in Comparative American Studies with a concentration in Identity and Diversity from the Oberlin College and Conservatory and an AA in Latin American and Latinx studies as well as an AS in social sciences from City College of San Francisco. They are also a member of the Pi Kappa Lambda Honors Association.

Born and raised on Yelamu Ohlone land to refugee parents, Helena is passionate about fighting for marginalized people and feels blessed that they get to build community through their art, teaching, and organizing every day.

ARTISTIC STAFF

DR. INGRID LESTRUD, ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Ingrid Lestrud enjoys an active career as a conductor and educator. Drawn to music and singing at an early age, she studied vocal performance as an undergraduate discovered a passion for conducting choral and orchestral music. She went on to study conducting at the graduate level, eventually completing her Doctor of Music degree Northwestern University, where she studied with Victor Yampolsky. While living in Chicago, Dr. Lestrud sang with the Chicago Symphony Chorus for several seasons under the baton of Riccardo Muti, performing in the Grammy awardwinning recording of Verdi's Requiem. She spent three years as the Voice Department Chair of the Merit School of Music, a community music school that serves over six thousand on underserved students with а focus communities. Collaborating with the Lyric Opera of Chicago, she worked with Renée Fleming to develop curriculum for Merit's Solo Voice Program, and her choir performed for and with Ms. Fleming for special events.

Dr. Lestrud has served on the faculty of several colleges in the midwest and on the east coast, leading choral and orchestral programs. Formerly the Principal Associate Conductor of the Grammy award-winning National Children's Chorus, she worked with some of the finest young singers in the nation, preparing them for concerts at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Walt Disney Concert Hall, and the Kennedy Center. In 2019, she performed as a member of the Living Arts Collective at the National Gallery of Art, conducting several movements of Schoenberg's Pierrot Lunaire in an event that showcased both musicians and dancers, highlighting an exhibition of lunar photographs and commemorating the fiftieth anniversary of the moon landing. Dr. Lestrud is also a conductor with Encore Creativity, a choral organization for older adults that focuses on preparing high quality performances while also fostering a sense of community through singing.

JOHN NOTHAFT, KEYBOARD ARTIST

John Nothaft from Vienna, Virginia, serves as the Director of Music Ministries at Lewinsville Presbyterian Church in McLean, VA as organist and choirmaster, created and curates their "Holy Happy Hour" concert series, and oversees a music ministry program of nine music ensembles. During the pandemic he started a weekly "Friday Fortissimo" music video. John graduated with his M.M. 18' from the studio of David Higgs at The Eastman School of Music. John received his B.M. 16' from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music and Hutton Honors College where he studied with Janette Fishell. Former organ teachers include Colin Andrews, and through the Potomac Organ Institute scholarship, Paul Skevington and Edward Alan Moore. John has studied sacred music with Bruce Neswick, Marilyn Keiser, Douglas Reed, and Robert Nicholls. He has studied piano with Marcia Chaplin and was awarded the Virginia Federation of Music Clubs Scholarship. He has participated in master classes with John Ferguson, Jeremy Filsell, David Higgs, and Ben Hutto. John has attended the McGill Summer Organ Academy, Oundle Organ Festival, and Westminster Choir College Organ Institute. He has served as organ scholar for RSCM courses in Houston, TX, Newport, RI and Washington, DC. In 2017, he was the first prize winner of the National Federation of Music Clubs Collegiate Organ Competition and recipient of the NPM members scholarship. As an Oundle recital winner he performed recitals at Truro and Chester Cathedral in the Cathedral UK. performances include the Noontime Cantata Series with the Washington Bach Consort, Chevy Chase Presbyterian's Bachathon. Piccolo-Spoleto L'Organo's music festival. Charleston S.C, and at St. Mark's Cathedral in Seattle, WA. John is an avid tennis player and USPTA-certified coach. John has written a musical children's book Old McHandel & His Musical Farm which is on sale in the U.S., Europe, and through Amazon.

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ABOUT THE CHORALE

The Chorale is a multi-generational chorus composed of members from Virginia, D.C., and Maryland. Singers come from a diverse range of professions and musical backgrounds, and members form strong connections with each other through musical rehearsals and fun social events. Performing a varied repertoire of smaller pieces and larger works for chorus and orchestra, some recent works include the Brahms Requiem, Beethoven's 9th Symphony, Gjeilo's "Song of the Universal," and Haydn's Lord Nelson Mass. For many seasons, the Chorale was honored to be part of the onstage chorus for the Messiah Sing-a-long at the Kennedy Center. Established in 1966, they have a long history of performing in special events, such as singing the national anthem at the MLB All-Star Game at Nationals Park, performing for the 40th anniversary of Arlington Thrive, and caroling at the Lee Highway Alliance Winter Festival of Lights. The Chorale also sponsors a youth outreach group called the Youth Community Council (YCC) that connects young singers ages 10-18 to other non-profits in the community, focusing on service through choral music.

Building on over fifty years of choral art, the Chorale continues to present ambitious programming, rehearsing and performing primarily in Arlington. Choral singing builds community, providing a space for members to work toward a common artistic goal as they create, connect, and sing together.

In Season 2022/23, we are partnering with ReactDC, an organization that assists Afghan refugees. Students from the Youth Community Council have the opportunity to help run activities and provide music at several events for Afghan families, including a recent holiday event. We gratefully acknowledge the support of Child's Play Books & Games and Read Early And Daily for their assistance with this project.
